On the 21st of July, 2022; we students of grades 9 and 10 visited “Deerwalk Auto Services” as a field visit. Deerwalk Auto Services, DAS is an auto repair center or shop. We all sat there and began questioning. “How many vehicles on average come in here for servicing?” or “How much is the pricing of servicing for 1 vehicle each?” were some common questions that were asked. Later, Mr. Surendra Nath Adhikari (chairman of DAS) joined us during the discussion. He answered almost every question related to DAS and everything financial. We were shocked to learn about the pricing being high and the number of vehicles coming per day for service. We were genuinely surprised to know that amongst all the quick services, DAS provides free Wi-Fi to the customers, waiting for lounge and good security.
